Understanding Your School Budget

Each May, residents of the school district vote on the school district budget that has been adopted by the Board of Education. The school district budget is a set of expenditure codes. The codes have specific meaning and purpose as identified by the Office of the State Comptroller. The three levels of organization are as follows:

- <u>Object Code</u> these define the purpose the money is budgeted for within each code, i.e, salaries, equipment, etc., (middle 3 digits _ _ _ . xxx. _ _)
- <u>Location Code</u> each building is assigned their own code number, i.e., Judy Jacobs Parkway Elementary = 19 (next 2 digits _ _ . xx . _)
- <u>Department Code</u> each department is assigned next their own code number (____.__.xx)

The following is a breakdown of the three different levels.

CODE 1000 – General Support

This code includes budget lines for the Board of Education, District Clerk, the annual budget vote and election, as well as Central Office (Offices of the Superintendent, Deputy & Assistant Superintendents), operations and maintenance, utilities, and insurance.

CODE 2000 – Instruction

Instruction is by far the largest category of expenditures. It includes all appropriations for regular elementary and secondary schools and all other general instructional support. In addition, expenditures for special education programs, as required by law, and budgets for extracurricular activities (clubs, intramurals, etc.) and interscholastic athletics are incorporated into this code.

CODES 3000 & 4000 ARE NOT USED AND ARE DELIBERATELY LEFT BLANK

CODE 5000 – Transportation

All student transportation, whether by our own buses or by contract with private companies, are coded here. Salaries for drivers and mechanics as well as the purchase and maintenance of the fleet are included.

CODE 6000's thru 8000's - Community Service and Recreation

The summer recreation program, youth and day care programs are coded here.

CODE 9000 - Undistributed

This code refers to budgeted items paid to agencies rather than vendors or individuals. Included here are all benefits, such as health, dental, and life insurance as provided for by contracts with employee groups, as well as payments to the Social Security and retirement systems. Also here are payments for interest and principal payments for borrowing, whether for short term purposes or for long term debt for capital projects.

The object of the expenditure is a secondary classification and identifies the item purchased or service obtained in order to carry out a function. A general breakdown of object codes is as follows:
