

# Tema Subject Pronouns in Spanish

## Subject Pronouns

A pronoun is a word that takes the place of a noun. A subject pronoun takes the place of the subject in a sentence. Examples in English: I, You, He, She, We and They.

**Pregunta: Which are the subject pronouns in Spanish?**

<b>Yo</b> ( I )	<b>Nosotros</b> (We)
<b>Tú</b> (You)	
<b>Él</b> (He)	<b>Ellos</b> (They - masculine)
<b>Ella</b> (She)	<b>Ellas</b> (They - feminine)
<b>Usted</b> (You) Polite form	<b>Ustedes</b> (You all)

Examples: Juan es alto. (John is tall.)  
Él es alto. (He is tall.)

Ana es inteligente. (Ana is intelligent.)  
Ella es inteligente. (She is intelligent.)

In Spanish, there are two forms of the pronoun 'You':

**Tú** – used with friends and people younger than you.

**Usted** – used as a polite form to address parents, grandparents, teachers, people of authority, etc. It is the respectful way of saying 'you'.

**Abbreviations:                      Usted - Ud.                      Ustedes - Uds.**
