LECTURA > La casa española

In Spanish towns and cities, almost everyone lives in an apartment. Out of town, where there is more space, people live in houses built in the traditional style of the region in which they live.


Unlike private houses in the United States, most Spanish homes do not have front yards or backyards with lawns and gardens. The traditional Spanish house, particularly in Southern Spain, is built around an open yard or court. This inner courtyard is called **el patio**. The patio is filled with potted plants and flowers and at times even has benches and a fountain.

This arrangement allows the family to relax outdoors in the sun while at the same time, enjoying the privacy of a closed-in area within their home.

A corridor, called el zaguán, leads from the street to the patio.

The typical Spanish home has a roof of curved, red tiles (tejas), a wroughtiron or wooden balcony, and iron grills (rejas) covering the ground floor windows. These iron bars let in fresh air while protecting the house.

They have also led to an interesting Spanish custom. Before being allowed into the home to be introduced to the girl's parents, the boyfriend got to know the girl by conversing with her through the iron grill. This custom was humorously called "comer hierro" (to eat iron).
